She will be speaking to us about Elizabeth Hutchinson Jackson, the mother of 1812 Major General, President Andrew Jackson. Mrs. Ingle was given the 2007 NSDAR Historic Preservation Award for "preserving the history of South Carolina Heroine, Kate Barry, with her children's book for all ages."

REGISTRAR NATIONAL GUIDELINES

- 1. All State Registrars should have copy of handbook, or acopy of pages of guidelines and instructions for preparing 1812 application papers.
 - a. Refer to Pages 36 40 in Handbook
- 2. Page 37, number 7. Applicants should comply with this requirement but if unable to comply must document why substitution is made.

Accept obit, baptism record/church records, picture of tombstone (if readable).

- 3. "Find a Grave" may be used but applicant should only copy tombstone and document where the cemetery is located and what inscription on tombstone says. Verbiage found on website is unacceptable as it is undocumented. Send a close up view of the tombstone where the writing is clear.
- 4. Page 1. Application All signatures must be in place
- 5. Pertinent information underlined in red
- 6. Generation to which the proof applies written on the top right corner of sheet
 - a. Do not staple papers
 - b. Do not use paper clips or sticky notes. If need note it should be typed on 8 ½ X 11 paper and included in documentation with the generation written in right upper hand corner.
- 7. Name of applicant, Applicant's chapter and ancestor written on back of each piece of documentation
 - a. Recommend typed and not use labels.
- 8. Correct fees payable to Treasurer National

Send Check Undated. Sometimes it takes weeks to process applications. If something is missing from the application or proofs, the check won't be rejected by bank when app finally approved.

- 9. Application will be held one year and if applicant is unable to complete then application is returnd to State Registrar.
- 10. Census records may not be used as only proof.
- 11. Only Registrar National places marks on paper.
- 12. If using previously approved 1812 application, then connection to paper must be documented
 - a. Copy of previously approved paper must accompany new application.
 (Registrar National does not have access to old applications, so need copy for reference.
- 13. Service must always be documented even if using previously approved paper.
 - a. 1812 Ancestor Index not proof of service
 - b. Send service documentation with application. Registrar National must see Service documentation.
- 14. The title page of books used as proof must be included.

Registrar National Guidelines (continued)

- 15. Applications must be printed back to back.
- 16. Each application or supplemental package must be complete. If referencing a previously approved application, that application must be included in each and every supplemental package. That is the way they are filed in Washington.
- 17. All documentation must be printed large enough to be readable without the use of a magnifying glass.
- 18. Proof for marriage, children, and service must be documented on final page of application.
- 19. Newspaper articles/obituaries must contain the name of the newspaper and the date of publication. Someone who died 'last Thursday" does not give a date.
- 20. Application must be sent to State Registrar in Triplicate. 1 will go to Nationals, 1 will stay with the Chapter and 1. will be filed with the State applications.
- 21. Nationals wants all to be submitted in a legal manilla file so they may drop this right into the 1812 files without further expense.

SC State Society Markers and Graves Chair

This Chairman would like to remind members that Memorial markers may be placed on the graves of individuals who rendered military, naval, or civil service from 1784-1815, and also on the graves of Real Daughters, Real Granddaughters, and members of the NS USD 1812. It is recommended that you order the grave markers at least six months ahead of time. All members are encouraged to complete the Grave Locations form for their new patriot ancestors!

The Department of Veterans Affairs will furnish, upon request, a government headstone or marker for the *unmarked* grave of any deceased eligible veteran, regardless of date of death.

The individual requesting the headstone must be a descendant of the veteran.

WHEREAS, "The Star-Spangled Banner", our National Anthem, was written during the War of 1812; and

WHEREAS, By the dawn's early light on September 14, 1814, Francis Scott Key saw the American flag flying over Fort McHenry, signifying an American victory, and was inspired to write the words of "The Star-Spangled Banner"; and

WHEREAS, "The Star-Spangled Banner" became our National Anthem on March 3, 1931 when President Herbert Hoover signed Public Law 823; and

WHEREAS, millions of Americans cherish and respect the words and music of "The Star-Spangled Banner"; and

WHEREAS, sporting and public events begin with the singing or playing of the National Anthem as a reaffirmation of patriotism and love of country; and

WHEREAS, The National Society United States Daughters of Eighteen Hundred and Twelve and the (state or chapter) calls for a day to observe the historical significance of "The Star-Spangled Banner" and to celebrate the words that Francis Scott Key penned in 1814:


